The Value of Collecting Patient Data

Society of Homeopaths webinar



We have developed a new simple tool called V-HAWK. This is a short questionnaire that collects information about people's health: virus related symptoms, COVID status, health related quality of life, long standing health conditions, treatments being used.

This will enable us to:

- Assess the incidence and prevalence of COVID-19 in the general population
- Obtain information on treatments/ strategies being used
- Assess the impact of COVID and treatments/ strategies being used on health and healthrelated quality of life

PROMs

Patient Reported Outcome Measures

What they are - standardized, validated questionnaires that are completed by patients.

What they do - measure the patients' views of their health status thereby providing insight into the impact of an intervention or therapy on the patient.

Patients' perceptions of their health and experiences are key to providing excellent patient-centred care.

'Describing what homeopaths do is the first step and it will lay solid foundations for the homeopathy profession and future research. Letting patients speak is the means by which homeopathy will move forward. This is a way for homeopathy to have its own voice heard and be a more recognised system of medicine, which has something valuable to offer.'
